General Guidance



Telemedicine, also called telehealth or video visit, makes it possible for patients to meet in real time with a health care provider through a computer, smartphone, or tablet. In some cases, a traditional telephone call can be an option for those without these devices.

Virtual connections are secure and HIPPA compliant. Professional world language or sign language interpreters are available to join a video

visit or phone visit.

Watch: A Guide for Patients

- What is the reason for your visit?
- What items do you want addressed during your visit?
- Follow your provider's instructions for virtual visit set up in advance
- Collect information in advance, such as: weight, temperature, heart rate, and blood pressure
- Update your list of medications, vitamins, and supplements
- Select a quiet, private space with good lighting for your visit. Charge the device and make sure the camera is set up at eye level
